

CALL FOR DATA COLLECTORS

Afya na Haki invites applications for data collectors under its Litigating Reproductive Justice in Africa (LIRA) Programme. The Programme aims to create an environment where Africa embraces reproductive justice through progressive, evidence-based and collaborative litigation for access to Sexual Reproductive Health and Rights (SRHR) at national, sub-regional, regional and international levels.

Ahaki seeks to hire data collectors for the collection, documentation and archiving of SRHR cases to create a repository that will be used to support SRHR litigation and evidence-based SRHR advocacy in Africa. The onboarded individuals will conduct field documentation of ongoing and decided SRHR related cases from court registries, archives and case law reports.

Key Responsibilities

In particular, the data collectors undertaking this assignment will be expected to perform the following tasks:

- » Participate in data collection in accordance with the study protocol;
- » Transcription and collation of data in a reporting tool;
- » Visit court registries, archives and law libraries and other places for data collection;
- » Answer questions that the respondents may ask during the course of data collection;
- » Participate in data validation to ensure quality of the data collected;
- » Provide daily updates on field work including interviews completed and other important information on field data collection;
- » Any other duties assigned by the data collection team leaders or the study Coordinator.

Key deliverables

- Weekly reports
- Project report

The candidate must be at least a second-year student in accredited universities in Uganda pursuing any of the following disciplines: law, public health, social sciences, gender studies, human rights, or any other discipline relevant to SRHR. The candidate should be passionate in conducting research, litigation and capacity enhancement in the area of SRHR. Work experience in project management and implementation will be an added advantage. The candidate should be proficient with the English language. Experience in application of data collection tools and methodologies, data analysis and data presentation will be an added advantage.
